Married woman of Rotorua. I am the petitioner.
On the 23rd December 1920 I was married to the respondent
in Levin. The document now shown to me is a certified copy
of my marriage certificate. I produce this as EXHIBIT A.
There have been four children of my marriage - as per my
petition. I am not living with my husband at the present
time. I ceased living with him on 27.11.53 - I remember
that date clearly and there is no possibility of a reconciliation
The Acknowledgment of Service now shown to me bears my
husband's signature.

JUNE EUNICE WILLS: (Sworn)

I reside at 7 James Street, Rotorua. Widow and the daughter of
the previous witness. I am aware that my parents separated in
1953. From that time down to the present time they have not
resumed cohabitation. They have not done so.

me that Mr Taylor was in the yard office behind
and that I could see him.

(c) I then went in and asked if he were Mr Taylor
and he said he was. I further asked him if he
was Trevor Clive Taylor and he answered in the
affirmative and I then informed him that I was
from the Magistrate's Court at Rotorua and I said
I had a divorce Petition to serve on him - he
said "All right". I then asked him when and where
he was married and he answered correctly as set out
in the Petition except that he was two days out
of the correct date of his marriage. I asked him
how many children there were of the marriage
and he replied correctly as set out in the Petition.
I asked him if he was the Respondent and he said
he was. I thereupon served him with the papers

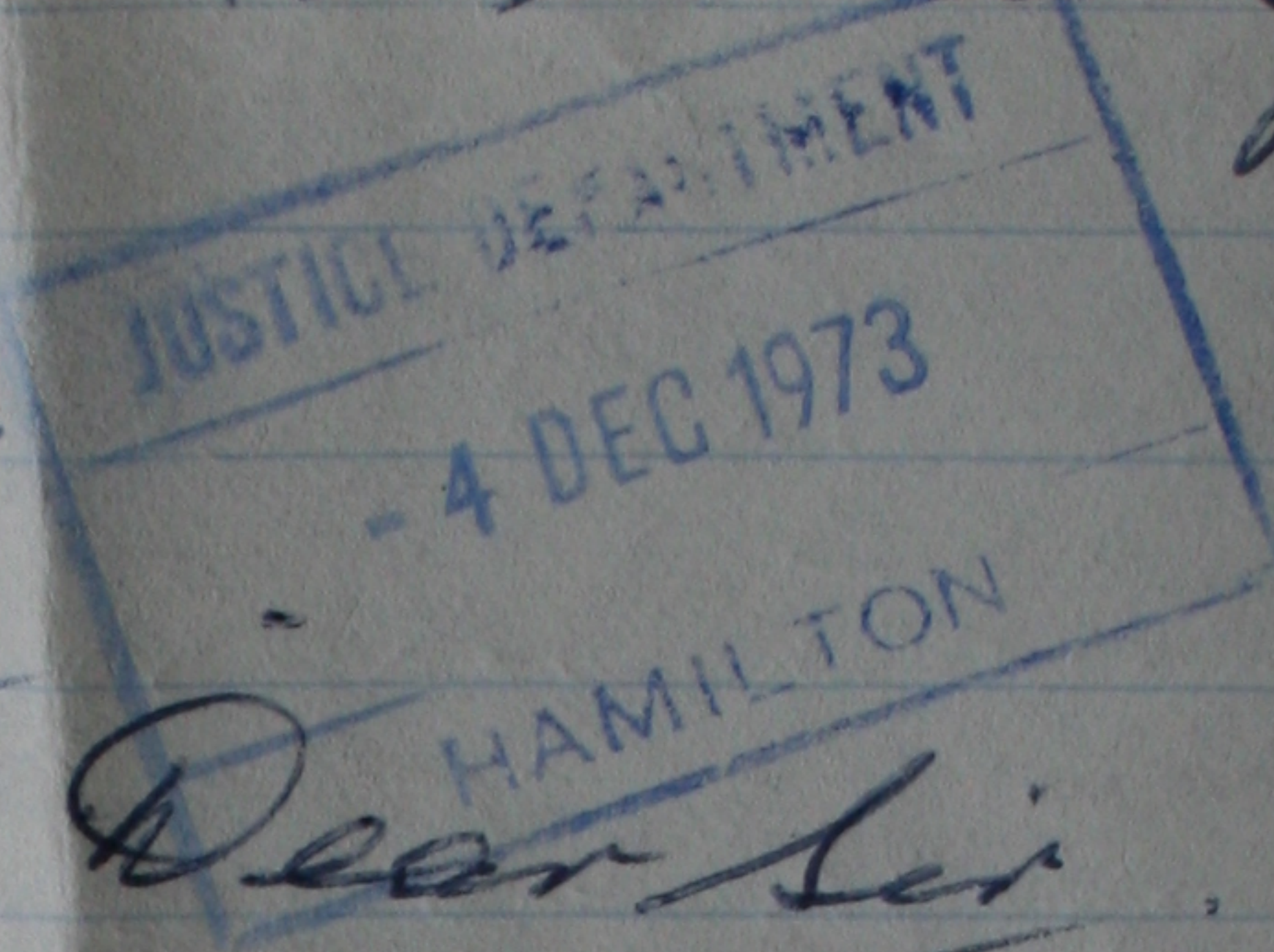
