HEMPSTEAD, TEX., Nov. 10.—County Attorney Mahan has returned from Field's store, the scene of the late tragedy on election day. He states that the evidence developed at the coroner's inquest showed that an old grudge was the original cause of the trouble, and that a brother of the young man killed had brought a Winchester to the polls and had made threats etc. On the strength of the testimony
