District Court at Hempstead.

HEMPSTEAD, Tex., Feb. 24.—The jury in the case of George Groce, white, after wrangling thirty hours, brought in a verdict this morning of not guilty.

Motions for new trials in the cases of Henry Mannix, a white man, convicted of murder and given a two years' sentence, and W. N. Doore, a negro, convicted of forgery, with a five years' term, will be argued to-morrow morning, and when this business is done the court will adjourn for the term.

The cases of Houlware, Wood and Walling-

ford were continued to next term on account of not having time to conclude the trials; this time the defendants were anxious for trial.

There were no civil cases tried during the term.

District Attorney Prickney has pushed the criminal docket from the start, and has made several convictions to the penitentiary.
