The records of this office shows Richard A. Gladish of Hempstead, Waller County, Texas, filed application for Confederate Pension March 23, 191h at which time he stated he was 7h years old, born in Frenklin County, Alabama. He had resided in Texas 52 years. The application for pension was approved under Pension File No. 30915.

Nr. Gladish stated he enlisted in the spring of 1862 and served until the close of the war. He stated he was discharged at Shrevesport, Ia. He was a member of Company H, Carter's Regiment, Wilks Brigade, Texas Infantry. The application for pension was approved on a report from the Adjutant General, War Department, Washington, D. C. The report follows:

"No. record has been found in this office of an organization known as Carter's Regiment of Texas Infantry, C. S. A.

The Confederate records show, however, that one Richard A. Gladdish, 3d sergeant, Company H, 3lst Regit. (Colonel Carter) Texas Cavalry, C. S.
