I WAS PRINCIPAL OF DANCYVILLE SCHOOL IN 1929-30, TEACHING 7TH & 8TH GRADES. LORRAINE COOK TAUGHT 4TH, 5TH, AND 6TH. OLIVIA POWELL TAUGHT 1ST, 2ND AND 3RD.

I WAS ONLY 20 YEARS OLD WHEN I WENT TO DANCYVILLE AND I WAS SURPRISED TO FIND I HAD FALLEN INTO A NEST OF KIN FOLK. I DID NOT REALLY LEARN ABOUT THE JONES FAMILY UNTIL MANY YEARS LATER WHEN I BEGAN TO RESEARCH MY FAMILY HISTORY, MY RECORD OF THE TEN GENERATIONS OF THE JONES FAMILY BEGINS WITH ROGER AND EVAN JONES, TWO SONS OF COL. ROGER JONES WHO CAME FROM WALES TO NORTH CAROLINA IN 1710. IN 1711, ROGER JONES WAS DECAPITATED DURING AN INDIAN MASSACRE.

MY PARENTS WERE HOWELL ARTHUR AND EL VIRGINIA MAUD KELSO NAYLOR. MY MOTHER WAS FROM THE DO ME GOOD CHURCH COMMUNITY AND TAUGHT AT THE DEZERN SCHOOL NEAR BROWNSVILLE, THE DO ME GOOD CHURCH WAS SO CALLED BECAUSE AN ELDERLY GENTLEMAN HAD SAID, "THIS CHURCH DO ME GOOD." THE OFFICIAL NAME WAS MT. PLEASANT AND WAS LOCATED PERHAPS AT HILLVILLE, NOT FAR FROM EUREKATON.

WILLIAM JAMES NAYLOR, JR., MY FATHER'S OLDEST BROTHER, WAS THE PASTOR OF THE DANCYVILLE METHODIST CHURCH FROM 1898 TO 1900.

I OBTAINED THE RECORDS OF HARMONY BAPTIST CHURCH FROM ALVIS STUART AND

HAD THEM COPIED FOR THE TENNESSEE STATE LIBRARY. THEY SHOULD BE PUBLISHED

BECAUSE THEY READ LIKE A NOVEL. THEY TOLD OF MONTHLY MEETINGS OF A COMMITTEE APPOINTED TO DISCULINE MEMBERS FOR BEATING THEIR WIVES, DRINKING OR LACK OF ATTENDANCE.

MY GRANDFATHER, WILLIAM JAMES NAYLOR, SR., WAS EXPELLED FROM HARMONY

BAPTIST FOR LACK OF ATTENDANCE, HIS CRIMES WERE; HE MOVED ACROSS THE RIVER.

MARRIED A METHODIST AND GAVE LAND* FROM HIS FARM FOR MARVIN'S CHAPEL METHODIST CHURCH. MR. TURNER, THE MAN WHO SPONSORED HIM FOR MEMBERSHIP, YEARS LATER SCRIBBLED BETWEEN THE LINES, THAT MY GRANDFATHER WAS GIVEN A LETTER WHICH EXONERATED HIM FROM ALL GUILT.

I PUBLISHED A BOOK, "KELSO KIN AND ALLIED FAMILIES" IN 1979, THE ALLIED FAMILIES ARE: COLLINS, HINES, JONES, CARNEY, NAYLOR, MOORE AND LINK. A COPY IS IN THE BROWNSVILLE LIBRARY. THE BOOK HAS A CHAPTER ON EACH ALLIED FAMILY INCLUDING THE JONES FAMILY. WILLIAM STEPHEN KELSO MARRIED ELIZABETH ANN JONES, MY GRANDMOTHER, THE DAUGHTER OF JAMES THOMPSON JONES. WHILE STILL IN NORTH CAROLINA, AS A 6 YEAR OLD, ELIZABETH HAD MARCHED IN A CIRCUS PARADE WITH TOM THUMB. ALTHOUGH TOM THUMB WAS 28 YEARS OLD THEY WERE THE SAME SIZE. WHEN THE FAMILY RETURNED TO TENNESSEE AND BEFORE SHE WAS MARRIED, ELIZABETH LIVED WITH HER SISTER ABIGAL, DURING THIS PERIOD SHE ATTENDED THE SOMERVILLE GIRLS' SEMINARY.

JAMES BOUGHT 640 ACRES OF LAND IN MEMPHIS (IF WE STILL OWNED THAT LAND CAN YOU IMAGINE WHAT IT WOULD BE WORTH?) HE RODE DOWN ON HORSEBACK TO LOOK AFTER IT AND DIED FROM HIS CLOTHES BEING FROZEN TO HIS BODY, WHEN HE WAS RIDING HOME. HE WAS THE FIRST BURIAL IN THE JONES FAMILY CEMETERY, ON THE JONES FARM, SOUTH OF

Cameras are permitted only in the open access areas of Public Service, not in the Archives and Manuscripts Room.

At the discretion of the Librarian on duty, scanners may be allowed in the Tennessee Reading Room and the Legislative History Reading Room, but NOT in the Manuscripts Reading Room. Items are considered on a case-by-case basis depending upon condition, copyright, and donor restrictions.
